The following is from Matt Sohn, son of Westside Wizards member Roger Sohn, who passed away unexpectedly this weekend.

From Matt Sohn, FaceBook Page, Friday, February 22, 2018:

My dad could always dazzle a crowd with his magic. But as is standard for any magician worth his salt, he'd never divulge how the trick is done. Even to his kids. As much as I'd poke and prod, he wanted the tricks to speak for themselves. That all started to change about six months ago. Every time I'd see him, he'd show me the secret behind one new trick. I joked that he needed to, that being able to impress potential customers with a trick or two could help me grow my business. He chuckled, and began to relent.

So he showed me a card trick here, a mentalism effect there. Then, this past Sunday in Palm Springs, he blew my mind in a "dress rehearsal" for his upcoming competition at the Magic Castle. The finale was a new take on 3-Card Monte, and I just had to know how it was done. It took a little convincing, but after everyone else had gone to bed, he stayed up with me and showed me the moves.

"It'll take practice, but here you go," he said. "Treat this with respect, it's dangerous in the wrong hands!"

Why, after nearly 30 years of keeping all his wizardly secrets to himself, had he finally begun showing me the ropes? I'll never know for sure, but I'd like to think it was because he knew his gifts were too great to not be passed on.

My dad brought the magic wherever he went, in whatever he did. Whether it was with a deck of cards, in front of a microphone as a wedding officiant, or weilding a scalpel in the operating room, he always did his small part in making the world a better, more joyful place.

So give me a little time to practice, then the next time any of you see me, ask me if I'm up for some 3-Card Monte. And hopefully by then I'll remember how to smile again, knowing my dad would be proud.

Bob thanked three members for continuing our tradition of entertaining the residents of the Providence St. Elizabeth Care Center, where we meet each month: Karl, Sirinda, and Wendy who put on a great magic show. The Ring will do it again next month.

After the introduction of several visiting guests and our traditional raffle we moved to the theme of the evening: Mental Magic. It was a theme that apparently stimulated quite a few of our magi to come up with a trick that would involve some mental prowess. Elroy Codding was able to find a chosen card from several piles. Gerry Schiller predicted which single word... from many thousands in a magazine!



Gadi Rowelski had selected. Gadi then showed us an effect with numbers on a chart (not a magic square, however) where he could predict the sum of those remaining after most had been crossed off.

The Greats of Magic A Series of Capsule Biographies of Famous Magicians by Gerald Schiller

Aldo Colombini

He was undoubtedly one of the funniest magicians who ever appeared on a stage; he created books and novel effects that number in the hundreds; he was the only magician in the history of the Magic Castle to be nominated in six different categories (comedy, stage, close-up, parlour, bar magician, and lecturer); and his Italian accent made him all the more lovable. But Aldo Colombini, sadly, left us on February 12, 2014 whe he died of a catastrophic stroke.

He was born March 19, 1951 in Maranello, Modena, Italy. At the age of fourteen he got a job at the Ferrari racing car factory. There he worked the assembly line doing tedious, repetitive factory labor for seven long years. Purely by chance, a friend lent him a book of magic tricks and suddenly his world changed. He studied the book and soon decided to utilize his new skill along with his witty personality and embark on a career in magic. He did children's shows and eventually got to do a spot on a kids' show on Italian television which evolved into a long-running series. By 1993, although he knew little English, he decided to move to the United States. And it was here that his career took off.

Utilizing his hilariously comic persona and combining it with his his brilliant magical skills, Aldo was soon appearing at virtually all the magic conventions, lecturing, performing, and promoting the many effects he was constantly creating. He performed in more than 61 countries and almost every state in the U.S. He was a FISM winner and twice won the Parlour Magician of the Year from the Magic Castle. For many years his column, "As Always, Aldo" appeared in *The Linking Ring*—a column that featured new and unusual tricks as well as news about his travels. For twenty years he also contributed to the British *Magigram* Magazine and he provided many tricks to Harry Lorayne's publication, *Apocalypse*.

Aldo was amazingly skilled in simplifying complex magic tricks. He could take an effect that involved numerous knuckle-busting sleights and come up with an approach that was just as effective, but so much easier. As Ivan Amodei said in a recent obituary, "He was a big teddy bear and a caring man. He created more magic in a month than anyone I know created in a year." Even now I chuckle as I remember Aldo Colombini spreading a deck of cards face up across a table, looking up at his audience and saying, "Ordinary deck?" and when they agreed, closing the spread and muttering, "Damn! I brought the wrong one!"

He left us at the age of just 63 and we very much miss him.
