








The Greats of Magic A Series of Capsule Biographies of Famous Magicians by Gerald Schiller



The Davenport Brothers

During the late 1800s there was a sudden popular interest in the subject of spiritualism and the possibility of communicating with the departed. Two sisters named Fox in Hydesville, New York, claimed to have been visited by spirits, and soon all over the country people began to believe in unexplained phenomena and the possibility that some individuals had the power to talk to the dead.

Ira Erastus Davenport was born in 1839 and his brother William Henry was born in 1841. Both grew up in Buffalo, New York. Their father was a local policeman. As with the Fox girls, Ira and William, as teenagers, began to experience what they claimed were visits from spirits, and said they were able to do unbelievable things. Realizing the commercial possibilities, their father resigned from the police force and began to take his sons around and exhibit their apparent abilities.

Eventually they developed an act they called "The Spirit Cabinet." The brothers were tied hand and foot and sat at opposite ends of a long bench facing each other. They were then locked in a large wooden cabinet along with various musical instruments. Soon tambourines would sound, drums would be heard, bells would ring and hands would appear at windows in the cabinet. If the doors were suddenly opened, the brothers would still be found tied in their original positions. A spectator locked in the dark cabinet with them would suddenly exit with his clothes turned inside out.

For more than ten years they toured the U.S. and England assisted by William Fay and J.B. Ferguson—a Presbyterian minister who would make long speeches during the show about the existence of ghosts and spirits. Many other magicians debunked their show and in Liverpool, England two amateur conjurers tied them so well that no phenomena took place and the Davenport Brothers had to be cut loose. The crowd rioted, destroyed the cabinet, and demanded their money back.

Magician and film maker George Melies even exposed their methods in a short film he made called The Cabinet Trick of the Davenport Bothers. In spite of detractors, they continued touring with their cabinet act. Perhaps many in the audience believed they had unusual powers and others were just looking for entertainment.

In 1877 while touring Australia, William Davenport died and Ira returned to America and went into retirement. But in 1895 Ira attempted to revive the show, Unfortunately for him, it was a failure and did not attract audiences. Ira died in New York in 1911 at the age of 72.

Just two years before he died, Ira had met with Harry Houdini and told him that the brothers had never claimed their cabinet was actually visited by spirits. Ira even showed the escapist the secret to his rope tie which Houdini would explain in his book, A Magician Among the Spirits.

Ironically, when young Houdini was just thirteen, he had seen a show like that of the Davenports and this gave him the incentive to work on doing escapes—but escapes that he would always maintain were done by purely physical dexterity, never with any claim of "spiritual intervention." And much later in his life, Houdini would embark on a crusade to expose the methods of fraudulent spiritualists, claiming he could duplicate any of their methods. Not one ever tried to claim the \$10,000 he offered if they could exhibit an effect he would be unable to explain.
