KOZMO!

Once again (for the June meeting) Ring 21 members turned on their computers, cell phones, and tablets to "meet," and to have a virtual session with Kozmo, the exciting and highly knowledgeable street performer.



A student of well known magician Jim Cellini, Kozmo provided a host of ideas, insights, and skills to all those who might want to do magic of the streets—or just learn some techniques that could be useful for any strolling performance.

Kozmo talked about his early career and how he was surprised when he initially went to a festival in Ithaca, New York, set up his table outdoors, and after just three days came home with almost \$2000. He quickly decided that working as a street performer was just the thing for him.

Over the many years Kozmo has been doing street magic, he has learned lots of tips and techniques he frequently uses. He likes to work at a table, in order to focus attention and to make his audience move up close to the action. He likes to

record almost all his shows—that way any "special" moments that occur won't be forgotten and he can use them again. He is all for getting any necessary street permits; that way you're a legitimate performer and you won't be competing with casual passersby.

Learning the names of those around him helps to personalize what he does and generally keeps them interested—and contributes to their staying for the whole show.

He'll often start by giving some coins to curious children, and asking them to bring their parents back and he'll do some special magic using the coins.


Kozmo went over many effects that work well in a "street" environment, including a "coins across" routine, some variations on the popular "matrix," and a signed card in the card box. For card effects he suggests using jumbo cards or cards with large indexes.



In the well over an hour lecture, there was just one promotion: that was for his magazine, Reelmagic, and he invited those watching the lecture to try a sample of it by going to his website: reelmagicmagazine.com.

The Greats of Magic A Series of Capsule Biographies of Famous Magicians Compiled by Gerald Schiller



Norm Nielsen

In the early 1940's a nine year old boy watched in amazement as his barber made a cigarette vanish from his hand. The two quickly became friends, and, as the young man watched the older man perform his magic, he quickly realized that this was the kind of life he wanted to lead.

And just a few years later, a teenage Norm Nielsen saved his money and attended a magic convention at

White Water, Wisconsin that was (fortunately) not too distant from where he lived in Kenosha.

The experience was overwhelming and he was now convinced that he definitely wanted to become a magician.

At the age of seventeen, he was off to Los Angeles and enrolled in the prestigious Chavez School of Magic.

He earned money bussing dishes and doing other part time jobs, but he spent most of his non-working time

devoted to hours of practicing sleights and routines with cards, coins, silks, and thimbles. When he felt his skills had reached the performance level, he auditioned for a theatrical agent.

The agent told him, bluntly, that what he was doing was an act that was virtually the same as one that countless other performers were doing. He gave him some advice that, years later, Norm realized, was some of the most valuable he would ever receive: "Develop your own act—make it something that's yours alone."

And though it took him several years, he did just that. It involved musical instruments, with the standout routine

his amazing floating violin—a violin that plays by itself as it floats in, out and around a cloth and ultimately vanishes.

He began to be booked all over the country and soon all over the world. He was also a guest on numerous television shows, including the famous Ed Sullivan show.

Norm was the winner of many awards from Magic Societies (including several from the The Magic Castle).

In 2008, he retired from active performing to concentrate his efforts on his skillful craftsmanship developing and designing effects for other magicians.

These included rubber bottles, lifelike rubber doves and coins and cards for manipulation.

He also expanded his interest in posters of famous magicians and became one of the most popular collector,

and dealer of spectacular advertising posters of the great performers of magic.

Unfortunately, Norm Nielsen, was diagnosed with Alzheimer's Disease in 2015, and left us in 2020 at the age of 86.
